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## **1. INTRODUCTION**

The Know Your Rights (KYR) program for caregivers builds awareness about rights and provisions for children with disabilities in:

- 1. Rehabilitation
- 2. Education
- 3. Health
- 4. Livelihood
- 5. Accessibility

It provides information on the process of acquiring a disability certificate and shares the importance of using the certificate to avail of their rights.

## 4. RESULTS

#### • 143 out of 193 who attended the KYR program could be contacted.


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
(38.4%) Obtained the certificate and were availing of provisions 13

(31%) Were not availing of provisions despite obtaining the certificate pre-KYR

(22%) Initiated the process of getting a certificate

(9%) Not initiated the process of obtaining the certificate


#### BARRIERS

#### Not availing of provisions despite obtaining the certificate pre-KYR

• Lack of clarity or not convinced about the diagnosis • Did not feel the immediate need to avail of provisions • Were not convinced about the benefit of a certificate in availing provisions

(Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Learning Disabilities, Intellectual Disability, Down Syndrome, Hearing Impairment)
