

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INTRODUCTION

Barriers to conducting training and creating community resources:

- Covid-19 pandemic
- Lack of direct access to children and families due to lockdown

Possible solutions:

- Creating and delivering a hybrid version of training
- Implementation of the training by community workers (working with children and families online and/or in-person)

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CDA TRAINING


The candidates could:

- apply knowledge to practice
- partner and collaborate with children and families
- modify environment to enhance participation of children with delays/ disabilities
- articulate (self-reported) happiness and confidence while working with children and families



RESULTS

- 12 community workers from remote corners of India trained in the CDA program in 2021
- Thus, it created grass root level resources to promote development and work with disabilities, despite the pandemic



CONCLUSION

Leveraging technology and modifying the existing curriculum to create a hybrid model enabled online delivery of the CDA training program. It opened up new avenues to reach out to individuals in remote locations and more children and families.

- Module 1 (Typical child development, 0-6 years)
- Module 2 (Guide for Monitoring Child Development)
- Module 3 (Assessment) of developmental domains and goal setting to work with children)
- Module 4 (Developmental disabilities and intervention to enhance childrens' participation)
- Supervision and mentorship (candidates working with children and families)
