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PR. AWAD MATARIA

Director of Universal Health Coverage/Health Systems (UHS) World Health Organization, Regional Office for Eastern Mediterranean (WHO-EMRO) Egypt

Pr. Awad Mataria is the Director of "Universal Health Coverage/Health Systems" at the WHO Regional Office for the Eastern Mediterranean. He has more than twenty years of experience in health systems, health economics and health financing. For the last fifteen years, Dr Mataria supported countries of the Eastern Mediterranean Region to reform their health systems with focus on health financing reforms to move towards Universal Health Coverage. With COVID-19, Pr. Mataria got interested in clarifying the conceptual linkages between Universal Health Coverage and Health Security through a health system strengthening lens.

Since his early life, and throughout his professional career, Dr Mataria developed special interest in working in fragile and conflict-affected settings. Dr Mataria has a Ph.D. in Health Economics and a Masters in Health Systems Analysis, following his undergraduate degree in Pharmacy. His areas of expertise are: Universal Health Coverage; health systems financing and organization; Social Health Insurance; using economics in health care priority setting; measuring the benefits of health care mainly using stated preferences techniques; economic evaluation of health care interventions; and National Health Accounts.

Pr. Mataria has more than seventy publications in high impact journals, including, Journal of Health Economics, Health Economics and The Lancet; and is co-editor of a landmark Book on: "Making Health Systems Work in Low and Middle Income Countries". He also presented at several international and regional conferences. Pr. Mataria is fluent in three languages: English, French and Arabic (mother-tongue).



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
DR. NADEEN HILAL

Advisor to the Minister of Public Health Lebanon

Dr. Nadeen Hilal has been serving as an Advisor to the Minister of Public Health in Lebanon since 2021. In this role, she has led numerous system strengthening initiatives and collaborated extensively with international organizations to improve healthcare delivery and policy frameworks in Lebanon. Her work contribution has focused on enhancing public health strategies, expanding healthcare services, and developing sustainable projects to support vulnerable populations.

Dr. Hilal is also a practicing Rheumatologist and a graduate of the American University of Beirut. She serves on the executive board of the Lebanese Society of Rheumatology, contributing her expertise to advance rheumatologic care in the region. Additionally, she holds a Master's degree in Public Health with a concentration in Health Management and Policy. Her academic contributions include several publications in the fields of Rheumatology and public health.





PR. WALID AMMAR

Former Director of the Lebanese Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) Director of the Doctorate and Research in Public Health Program Saint Joseph University (USJ) Lebanon

Professor Walid Ammar is currently, Director of the Doctorate and Research in Public Health Program at St. Joseph University in Beirut, and the chairman of the Independent Oversight and Advisory Committee (IOAC) of the WHO.

He served as Director General of the Ministry of Public Health of Lebanon (1993-2020). Under his leadership, reform efforts led to significant improvement in health indicators while decreasing the GDP share of health expenditures. He established the Primary Health Care Network in Lebanon, led the Hospital Accreditation Program, and introduced performance contracting with the private sector.

His innovative collaborative leadership and open networking model of governance lied behind these achievements and the resilience of the health system.

Professor Ammar was appointed in 2011, Commissioner in the United Nations Commission on Information & Accountability for Women & Children's Health. He served as a member of the Executive Board (EB) at the World Health Organization (2012-2015). He has published over 200 per-reviewed papers and book chapters in addition to two books: "Health System and Reform in Lebanon" (2003), "Health Beyond Politics" (2009).

Professor Ammar is an Honorary Member of the Delta Omega Society (2013) and the recipient of the WHO Shousha Foundation Prize (2016). He is Officer in both the French National Order of Merit and the Belgium's National Order of the Crown. He was awarded in June 2020, the Golden Medal of the National Order of the Health Merit by the President of the Republic of Lebanon.

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DR. IMAD HOUT

Deputy of the Parliament's Public Health Labor and Social Affairs Committee Lebanon

Dr. Imad Hout is a Lebanese Member of Parliament from 2009 to 2018 and was re-elected in 2022. During his tenure, he has been member of the Administration and Justice Committee, as well as the Health and Social Affairs Committee. He is actually also a member of the parliamentary committee discussing the Universal Health Coverage draft Law.

Dr. Hout holds a medical degree from Saint Joseph University in Lebanon and universities in Paris. He is a member of the French College of Orthopedic Surgery and has earned the title of Assistant Professor from the Parisian Academy. In addition, he holds a diploma in Healthcare Management from Saint Joseph University and a diploma in Human Resource Development from Paris.

Beyond his political and medical careers, Dr. Hout is a lecturer at the Lebanese University. He serves as the head of the Lebanon branch of the organization "Arab Parliamentarians Against Corruption" and held the position of Assistant Secretary-General of the Arab Physicians
